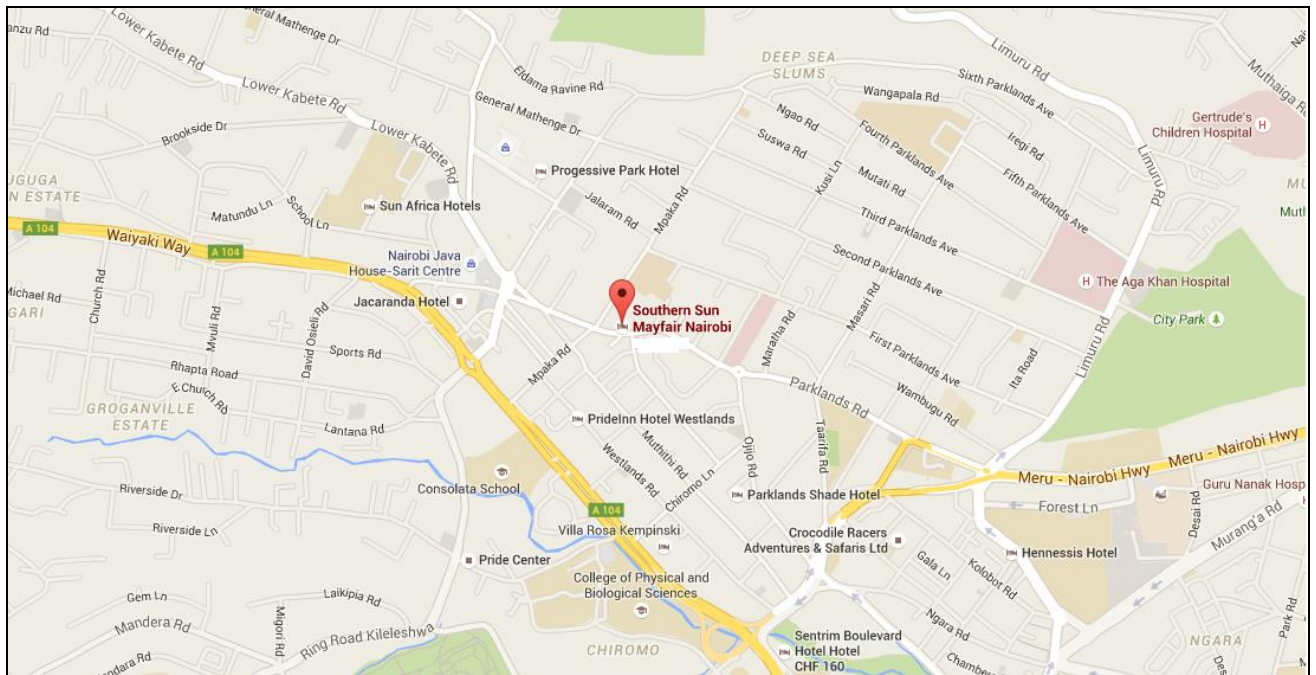
## Venue

The 9<sup>th</sup> GNC Annual Meeting is organised jointly by the Global Nutrition Cluster (GNC) and the Save the Children Regional Office for East Africa.

The Southern Sun Mayfair Nairobi sits in the Parklands area of Nairobi, within ten minutes' drive from the city centre and approx. 30 minutes from the airports.



## From/To Jomo Kenyatta International Airport

*From Jomo Kenyatta International airport to the hotel, the taxi fares are as follows:*

- One way \$37 per taxi (single occupation)
- One way \$18.5 per person sharing the same taxi
- One way Tour Van (9 seaters) \$65
- One way Rosa Bus (18-25 seaters) \$75

We recommend you to book your flight ticket as soon as possible. In order to make the appropriate arrangements. Please note that the main meeting will start on **Tuesday, 13<sup>th</sup> October 2015 at 09.00** (welcome coffee at 08:30) and finish on **Thursday, 15<sup>th</sup> October at 17.00, followed by a one hour side meeting each day.**

The **GNC SAG members, National Nutrition Cluster Coordinators and Information Management Officers, including GNC Rapid Response Team members** are requested to arrive on **Monday, 12<sup>th</sup> October at 09.00** stay until **Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> October 2015 until around 16.00.**

## Visa

## Climate

Although Nairobi is situated in the middle of East Africa, its high altitude—about a mile above sea level—means that the city's climate is mild year-round. Visitors are spared the extreme, blistering temperatures found in other regions of Africa, or even other areas within Kenya.

A rainy period occurs between mid-October to mid-December, the period referred to locally as the 'short' rainy season. The month of October is characterized by *gradually falling* daily high temperatures, with daily highs around 26°C throughout the month, exceeding 29°C or dropping below 23°C only one day in ten.

Make sure you bring a warm fleece, jacket, sweaters and scarves for some chilly evenings and maybe a coat and boots for a rainy day.

## Accommodation

## Money Exchange

The **shilling** (sign: **KSh**; code: **KES**) is the currency of Kenya. It is divisible into 100 cents. US Dollars and other major currencies could be exchanged at the hotel or at the banks and official exchange kiosks across the city. The US\$ - KES exchange rate (as of Aug 2015) is 103 KES for 1.00 US\$.
