About the CMAM Toolkit

CMAM has been widely adopted as the most effective strategy to treat acute malnutrition in children under five years old. The CMAM Toolkit is a collection of technical documents and tools often needed by program managers to enable them to plan for and initiate CMAM program implementation, either at the onset of a crisis, during a protracted crisis or as a new nutrition activity. The Toolkit is **NOT** a re-creation of existing tools and resources, but as an easy-to-use compilation of these tools and resources. The Toolkit is available in both English and French.
