

## The Alliance's Work to date


- From April 2020 to March 2023 the Alliance has:




The Alliance provides technical support to the UN, NGOs, Network agencies, Local NGOs, Governments, and more.




## Where are requests coming from?

## Cross-cutting themes workstreams



There are 6 established workstreams looking at cross-cutting themes

• Anti-racism and Localization (A&L); Gender & GBV; Disability; Humanitarian Development Nexus (HDN); Accountability to affected populations (AAP) and Climate Change

#### Some key achievement this quarter include:

- Gender and GBV: First gender and nutrition in-country support developed and ToR finalized.
   Support began in late March in Ethiopia. A joint mission with UNICEF GBViE team planned for next quarter.
- AAP: Poster featured at GNC annual meeting.
- A&L: GNC Annual Meeting A&L Side Event presentation and poster, conclusion of the localisation consultancy with Partnership Brokers Association and NutritionWorks.
- HDPN: poster featured at GNC annual meeting, collation of feedback from outreach survey on priorities for the workstream
- *Disability*: developed of workplan, and provided support to a request submitted to the Alliance
- Climate Change: poster featured at the GNC annual meeting

#### Webinars & Knowledge Management



#### **Webinars:**

- One webinar was held this quarter with the Simplified Approaches Working Group on the topic of *Introducing Global Training Toolkit on Simplified Approaches for the Detection and Treatment of Child Wasting; Chapter 1: Family MUAC.*
- 523 participants attended, 54% were from local NGOs or national governments.

#### **Learning Needs & Products**

- This quarter work continued on several learning pieces:
  - A signposting document on IMAM/CMAM resources
  - A learning brief on the harmonization of CVA approaches in Nigeria
  - Ukraine IYCF support learning piece
- Three case studies were published this quarter highlighting learning from Alliance supported work in <u>Myanmar</u>, <u>Somalia</u>, and <u>Uganda</u>

## Thought Leadership Updates



- 5 Global thematic working groups with 217 members ran in Q1 IFE core group, Wasting GTWG, NiS GTWG, CVA GTWG, and MAMI GTWG, along with 2 Taskforces: Maternal Nutrition and Ebola
- <u>Guidance on chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear (CBRN) threats</u> was finalized during this quarter
- Three requests were escalated to GTWGs for support
  - Translation of key resources for Turkie/Syria earthquake response, and provision of background IFE guidance in the context of an earthquake
  - CVA support to scale up CVA for nutrition outcomes in Myanmar
  - Cholera messaging was refined by the IFE CG in response to a question posed to the group. Existing guidance is available, but was noted to be confusing and required contextualization
